Subject: Discussion and Possible Action Regarding Proposed Amendments

to Board-Sponsored Legislation: SB 1024 (Ochoa Bogh) Healing Arts: Board of Behavioral Sciences: Licensees and Registrants (Business and Professions Code (BPC) §§ 4980.31, 4980.32, 4980.43.2, 4980.43.4, 4989.17, 4989.48, 4996.7, 4996.8, 4996.23.1, 4996.23.3, 4996.75, 4999.46.2, 4999.46.4, 4999.70, and 4999.71)

Summary

The Board is sponsoring <u>SB 1024</u> (Ochoa Bogh) this year. The Board approved the amendments currently in bill at its meeting on November 17, 2023.

Background

At this time, the bill proposes the following two changes to the Board's practice acts:

1. <u>Changes to Requirements Regarding the Physical Display of a License or Registration</u>

All licensees and registrants receive a paper copy of their license or registration from the Board. This copy contains the person's name, license number, type of license, and expiration date. The law requires that they display this license in a conspicuous place in their primary place of practice. This law was likely written this way before the Board had an online license lookup feature, to ensure a client could see that their therapist actually had a license or registration when in the office for an appointment.

The increased use of telehealth in therapy suggests that this law needs updating. Some therapists' primary place of practice may be virtual, or they may be seeing clients via telephone, making it difficult or impossible for the physical paper copy of the license or registration to be on display.

As a solution, the Board is proposing to remove the requirement to physically display a license or registration. Instead, it proposes requiring that a therapist

provide their license information in the written notice to clients that therapists are already required to provide prior to initiating psychotherapy services.

2. Clarifying who Qualifies as a "Supervisee"

All individuals seeking a license with the Board are required to register with the Board as an associate and gain 3,000 hours of experience under supervision upon graduation from their qualifying master's degree program.

The law uses the term "supervisees" to refer to those individuals required by the Board to be under supervision. To ensure quality supervision, there are some circumstances in which the law limits the number of "supervisees" per supervisor. However, due to ambiguity in its interpretation, this bill is proposing amendments to further clarify who qualifies as a "supervisee".

Discussion of Proposed Additional Amendments

Legislative Counsel and the Legislature's Business and Professions Committee have provided preliminary feedback on the proposed language. Based on that feedback, staff is recommending the Board consider several amendments to the bill. The amendments fall into the following categories and are shown in red text in **Attachments A** and **B**.

1. Amendments to license display and required notice requirements.

Sections Affected: BPC §§4980.31, 4980.32, 4989.17, 4989.48, 4996.7, 4999.70, 4999.71. (See **Attachment A**)

The Board received feedback that it might be appropriate to continue to require the physical display of a license if a therapist is seeing clients in person. Therefore, staff is recommending an amendment to require this. The bill would continue to propose requiring the licensee or registrant's license or registration information be included in the required notice to consumers, which means that consumers would be provided this information at the beginning of services, regardless of whether therapy is in person or via telehealth.

Additionally, the bill is currently proposing that the required notice contain specified information about a therapist's license, and it additionally requires that a licensee must inform their clients of any changes to the active status of their license. Based on feedback that this may cause confusion, staff is suggesting that the amendment to require notification if the active status changes be deleted. If a license falls out of active status, the licensee is not allowed to see clients, and therefore would already have to inform the client.

2. <u>Standardize the use of the term "individual" versus "person" throughout</u> the language.

Where the bill proposes limiting the number of persons receiving supervision, Legislative Counsel noted that in some places the bill limits the number of "individuals" and in other places it limits the number of "persons." They advised that a consistent term should be chosen. Staff has chosen to replace the term "individuals" with "persons" in these instances.

Sections Affected: BPC §§4980.43.4, 4996.23.3, 4999.46.4. (See **Attachment A**)

3. Strike obsolete date of July 1, 2020.

Sections Affected: BPC §§ 4980.32, 4989.17, 4996.75, 4999.71. (See **Attachment A**)

The reference to July 1, 2020 in the above-referenced sections represents the effective date after which the required notice to clients must be delivered to all new clients. As the date has already passed, it is no longer needed and should be deleted for clarity.

4. Add duplicate language due to sunsetting section.

Sections Affected: BPC §§4980.43.2, 4996.23.1, 4999.46.2. (See **Attachment B**)

Note: This particular amendment is being shown in a separate attachment, **Attachment B**, for clarity purposes. The sections shown in that attachment will need to be both added to the bill and amended.

The bill already makes amendments to the currently operative version of these sections. However, there is a second version of these sections in law that becomes effective January 1, 2026, if the Board elects not to extend the allowance that permits supervision via videoconferencing in all settings. Legislative Counsel has advised that the Board needs to have proposed amendments in this bill in both versions of these sections, so that if the Board decides in the future that the currently operative version of these sections should sunset in 2026, the new provisions that this bill is proposing do not also sunset.

Recommendation

Conduct an open discussion of the proposed changes shown in red in **Attachments A** and **B.** Direct staff to make any discussed changes and any non-substantive changes, and amend the language in **Attachments A** and **B** into SB 1024.

legislative counsel's digest

SB 1024, as introduced, Ochoa Bogh. Healing arts: Board of Behavioral Sciences: licensees and registrants.

(1) Existing law establishes the Board of Behavioral Sciences within the Department of Consumer Affairs and requires the board to regulate various registrants and licensees under the Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist Act (LMFTA), the Educational Psychologist Practice Act (EPPA), the Clinical Social Worker Practice Act (CSWPA), and the Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor Act (LPCCA). Existing law makes a violation of the provisions under those acts a crime.

Existing law, under those acts, requires a licensee to display their license in a conspicuous place in the licensee's primary place of practice. Existing law requires a licensee or registrant to provide, before initiating specified services or as soon as practicably possible thereafter, a client with a prescribed written notice that specifies that the board receives and responds to complaints regarding services within the scope of the licensed practiced, among other things.

This bill would repeal the requirement that a licensee display their license in a conspicuous place in the licensee's primary place of practice. The bill, commencing July 1, 2025, would require the above-described written notice to additionally include information about the licensee or registrant, including, among others, the licensee's or registrant's full

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name as filed with the board and the license or registration number, as prescribed. The bill would require a licensee or registrant to inform their clients of any change to the active status of their license or registration.

(2) Existing law, under the LMFTA, CSWPA, and LPCCA, requires an applicant for licensure to have, among other things, at least one hour of direct supervisor contact, as defined, in each week for which experience is credited in each work setting. For purposes of that definition, existing law refers to the individual receiving supervision as the supervisee. Existing law prohibits supervisors of supervisees, as specified, from serving as individual or triadic supervisors for more than 6 supervisees at any time, as provided.

This bill would revise the definition of "one hour of direct supervisor contact," delete references to "supervisee," and instead refer to that individual as the person receiving supervision for providing clinical mental health services. The bill would delete the above-described prohibition and instead prohibit supervisors in nonexempt settings from serving as individual or triadic supervisors for more than a total of 6 individuals who are receiving supervision for providing clinical mental health services in a nonexempt setting.

(3) Existing law, under the CSWPA, requires a licensee to complete specified actions on or before the expiration date of the license to renew an unexpired license. Existing law requires the current renewal receipt to be displayed near the licensee's license.

This bill would repeal the above-described requirement that the current renewal receipt be displayed near the licensee's license.

(4) Because the bill would impose new requirements on licensees and registrants under the LMFTA, EPPA, CSWPA, and LPCCA, the violation of which is a crime, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that no reimbursement is required by this act for a specified reason.

- (A) The supervisor and the associate's employer have a written contract providing the supervisor the same access to the associate's clinical records provided to employees of that employer.
- (B) The associate's clients authorize the release of their clinical records to the supervisor.
- (c) Supervisors of supervisees At any one time, supervisors in a nonexempt-setting settings shall not serve as individual or triadic supervisors for more than a total of six-supervisees at any time. Supervisees may be registered as associate marriage and family
